



Signal Athletic Code of Conduct

We all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behaviour in the game. We all bear a collective responsibility to set a good example and help provide a positive environment in which children can learn and enjoy the game. This club is supporting the FA's Respect programme. Children's football is a time for them to develop their technical, physical, tactical and social skills. Winning isn't everything.

Signal Athletic football Club is asking you to play your part and observe the FA's Respect Code of Conduct for spectators and parents/cares at all time.

Code of Conduct for Parents, Spectators & Carers

I will:

- 1) Remember that children play for FUN.
- 2) Applaud effort and good play as well as success. Avoid criticising a player for making a mistake- mistakes are part of learning.
- 3) Always respect match officials decisions even when you don't agree with them.
- 4) Appreciate good play from whatever team it comes from.
- 5) Remain outside the field of play and within the designated spectator areas (where provided).
- 6) Never engage in, or tolerate offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour.
- 7) Let the coach do their job and don't confuse the layers by telling them what to do.
- 8) Encourage players to respect the opposition, referee and match officials.
- 9) Support positively. When players make a mistake offer them encouragement not criticism.
- 10) If the need arises to question, please do so at the appropriate time and place and think of the effect your behaviour may be having on others.
- 11) Assist where you can with match day activities, transport, putting nets up etc.
- 12) Ensure that my child attends training and matches at the given times and if unable to attend I will contact manager or coach to advise.
- 13) Ensure that my child has the correct kit and is suitably attired for the conditions in training nights and match days.
- 14) Where possible support club activities
- 15) Ensure that club and tournament fees are paid at the appropriate time.

I understand that if I do not follow the code, /all of the following actions may be taken by my club, County FA, league or The FA.

I may be

- 1) Issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official
- 2) Required to meet with the club, league or CFA welfare Officer.
- 3) Required to meet with the Club committee.
- 4) Obligated to undertake an FA education course.
- 5) Obligated to leave the match venue by the club.
- 6) Requested by the club not to attend future games.
- 7) Suspended or have my membership removed
- 8) Required to leave the club along with any dependants.

In addition the FA/County FA could impose a fine and /or suspension on the club.
